Representatives from Health Services across the region have spent a very productive couple of days in Halls Gap planning for the introduction of the Interns to health services. Consideration was given to the

Priorities identified for action were to be able to use the mobile capability of the Intern to facilitate patient access to the regional services — psychiatry, aged care assessment and palliative care. Joint working groups are being developed to progress this access.

The staff were also introduced to a range of the change management theories to assist their planning processes and enjoyed the networking opportunity created by the workshop.

The Interns have been delivered to St Arnaud, Nhill, Edenhope, Bacchus Marsh, and Ararat over the past few weeks. These are all online and available for use.

The initial training for staff was completed last week and staff identified a number of instances where this technology will be of value to patients of East Wimmera. We look forward to the stories in the future.



The first additional room based videoconferencing units have been ordered and will be delivered to Grampians Community Health, Stawell; East Grampians Community Health Ararat; and Palm Lodge in Horsham. We are expecting delivery of these around the end of Sept.

The next round of deliveries for the Interns is also being organised at present. They are scheduled to be delivered to Hepburn Health Services, Dunmunkle Health Services, Ballarat Health Services, Rural North West and an additional one for East Wimmera Health Services which will be placed at their site in Donald.
